- a. I'm going to buy two tickets for *T in the Park*, as long as they are not too expensive.
- b. I'm going to buy two tickets for *T in the Park*, as long as they are not too expensive.
- c. I'm going to buy two tickets for *T in the Park*, as long as they are not too expensive.

Use your planner for this task

- Hold up **green** if you think option **a** is correct
- Hold up **amber** if you think option **b** is correct
- Hold up **red** if you think option **c** is correct

Correct answer

b. I'm going to buy two tickets for *T in the Park*, as long as they are not too expensive.

Why?

- **Two** is the number 2.
- **Too** means more than enough, as in *too big*.
Too means *also*, as in “*I’m coming too!*”
- **To** is part of a verb, as in *to buy*.
To is a preposition, as in I am going *to* school.
