- Handle enquiries from patients
- Manage waiting lists
- Send samples for medical testing
- Update patients notes
- Manage the filing of info
- Type and send letters
- Oversee the office budget

Career Insight: Social Worker

Average Salary: £36,920 <u>No. Employed</u>: 12,000 This job requires you to give support, help and advice to vulnerable adults and children to help improve their lives.

You would be expected to:

- Assess individual's circumstances
- Build strong relationships
- Offer information and organise support services
- Organise and manage support plans
- Take part in teams meetings
- Keep records/write reports
- Give evidence

Career Insight: Art Therapist

Average Salary: £22,880 No. Employed: 2,300

This job requires you to use art and other creative strategies to help vulnerable people express themselves and overcome their challenges. You would work with people who are going through a challenging time or who had experienced trauma.

You would be expected to:

- Create new activities to allow people to express themselves
- Adopt a patient, calm and supportive attitude
- Have a knowledge of various artistic techniques
- Work closely with other professionals such as healthcare professionals and social work
