

### Where Next?

- 1. Leave school if 16 before 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2022
- 2. Stay at school until Christmas then leave if 16 before 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2023
- 3. Attend college, training, work experience etc until Statutory leaving age by agreement with Chief Education Officer
- 4. Stay on, choose subjects that will lead to qualifications for employment, college, university etc.

### Senior Phase Programmes

- ✓ Wide range of courses on offer across a variety of sectors majority accredited by the SQA.
- ✓ Gives pupils the opportunity to learn in an environment outside of the classroom developing skills for learning, life and work.
- ✓ Helps to support the transition from school exposure to different learning environment / work based learning
- √ Two options available to students in S5/6:

### **Vocational Programme**

- Students attend college/ university course two afternoons per week
- Students choose this as one of their subjects (Column B).
- Courses range from SCQF Level 3 7 (national 3 – Advanced Higher)

### **Foundation Apprenticeship**

- Worked based learning opportunity for students in S5 and S6
- Developed by Scottish Government and Skills Development Scotland
- Addressing skills gaps in Scotland's growing industries
- SCQF Level 6 (Same level as a Higher)
- Qualification delivered through time at college and time on work placement with employer

### Further Information and How to Apply

- Pupils should discuss Senior Phase Vocational courses with their Guidance Teacher during the option choice process. (Let Mrs Kerr know if you are interested in a Foundation Apprenticeship - Discuss timetable & suitability)
- It is important that all students choosing the senior phase option ensure it is the best progression pathway for their current year of study. If a student in S5 requires 5 Higher passes for entry to University/Apprenticeship, they may wish to consider studying a vocational programme in S6 instead.
- This year's senior phase prospectus is still in production, but last year's can be accessed
  at <u>Senior Phase Prospectus</u>. Pupils who wish to undertake a vocational programme will
  need to complete an application form online.

#### Skills

#### Learners will be able to:

- listen, talk, read and write, as appropriate to purpose, audience and context
- understand, analyse and evaluate texts, including Scottish texts, as appropriate to purpose and audience in the contexts of literature, language and media
- create and produce texts, as appropriate to purpose, audience and context
- apply knowledge and understanding of language



#### Opportunities for Learners

#### Learners will be able to:

- use different media for learning and communication
- understand how language works
- use language to communicate ideas and information in English
- think creatively and critically
- appreciate a wide range of literature and texts
- develop detailed and complex language skills



#### Assessment

- To gain Higher English, learners must pass the two Units and the Course Assessment (Portfolio and two Question Papers for 100 marks)
- Units are assessed as pass or fail by the school/centre and are quality assured by the SQA.
   Achievement of Units is recorded on the learner's qualifications certificate
- Unit Assessment (or 'evidence of learning') will assess each of the four language skills: reading, listening, writing and talking. The SQA has provided examples of Unit Assessments that teachers/ lecturers can use as they are, or adapt to suit the needs of their learners
- The Course Assessment is a Portfolio (30 marks) and a Question Paper (exam for 70 marks overall) which has two components (see below). These are marked externally by the SQA
- Higher English is graded from A to D or as No Award.



Paper 1 Reading for Understanding, Analysis and Evaluation 1 hour 30 minutes, 30 marks

Two non-fiction pieces of writing are given, with questions

Portfolio Two written texts of no more than 1300 words, demonstrating the learner's ability to

write in different genres, for different purposes 30 marks



Progression Higher courses can stand alone or follow on from National 5 qualifications and may lead to Advanced Highers, the Scottish Baccalaureate and a range of qualifications within Further and Higher Education.



### The Choice

**S4** → **S5** 

7 subjects in S4 reduce to 5 in S5

<u>S5→ S6</u>

5 subjects in S5 reduce to a *minimum* of 4 in S6

### **Reasons for Choice**

Ability & aptitude

Related to possible career or Further/Higher Education

Enjoyment

Certainty over choices

### **Poor Reasons for Choice**

It's what your friends are doing

You don't like the teachers in that department

You like a certain teacher

You were told to do it by your parents

It sounds good but you have not really checked it out

## Subject choice in S6

### When to upgrade Highers?

If a Higher which you gained at B or C is required at A or B for entry to your chosen course / pathway

### When to take Advanced Highers?

- If you enjoy a subject, want to continue studying it and are close to the required entry grades for your chosen course by the end of S5
- If you gained a C in a Higher required at B, but are very confident you can gain at least a C at Advanced Higher, this is an alternative to upgrading the Higher

In both cases, it is important to check the entry requirements in the undergraduate prospectus, to find out what credit is given to Advanced Highers for the courses which interest you or what Highers are required for entry.

## Subject choice in S6

If you require additional qualifications you should use S6 to:

- Meet any specific subject and grade requirements
- Take subjects which will develop and demonstrate relevant skills, e.g. essay based subjects for Social Sciences or Business; Art/Graphic Communication for Architecture
- Take subjects you are good at, to help you gain strong grades and ultimately build a strong CV




