DEVELOPING THE YOUNG WORKFORCE

Developing the Young Workforce (DYW) is a **seven-year Government programme** (2014-2021) that aims to **better prepare young people for the world of work** and **reduce youth unemployment** by 40%.

Some of the ways to achieve this aim are:

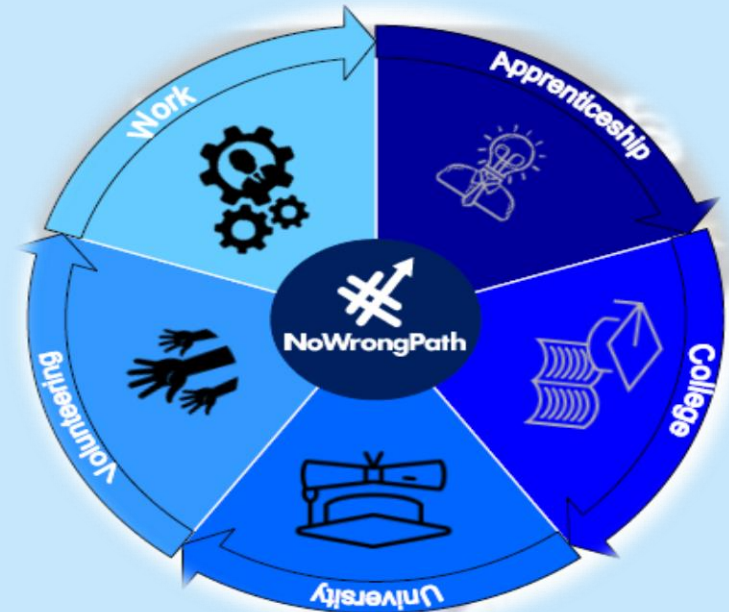
- Developing young people's learning about career management and the world of work
- Developing young people's skills for learning, life and work so they are better prepared to enter and sustain employment
- Ensuring young people have opportunities to engage in work-based learning (in and out of the classroom)
- Working collaboratively with a range of partners (SDS, employers, colleges, universities and training providers) to support young people when planning their future pathways

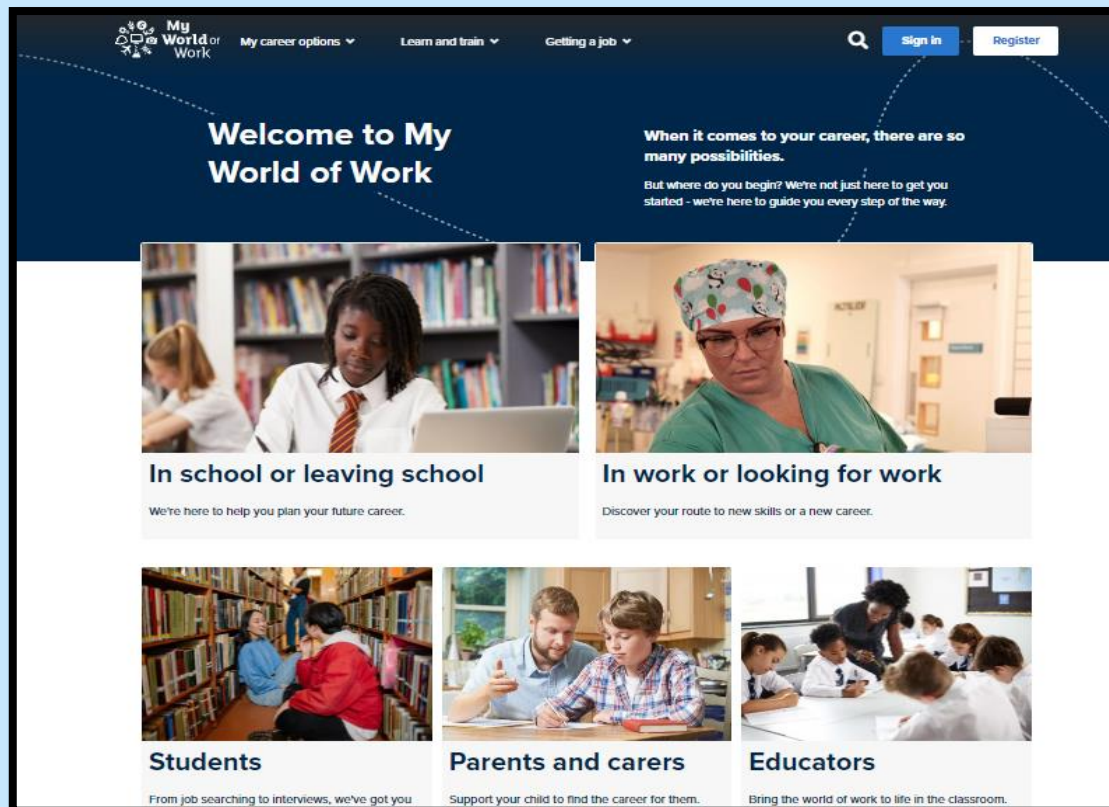



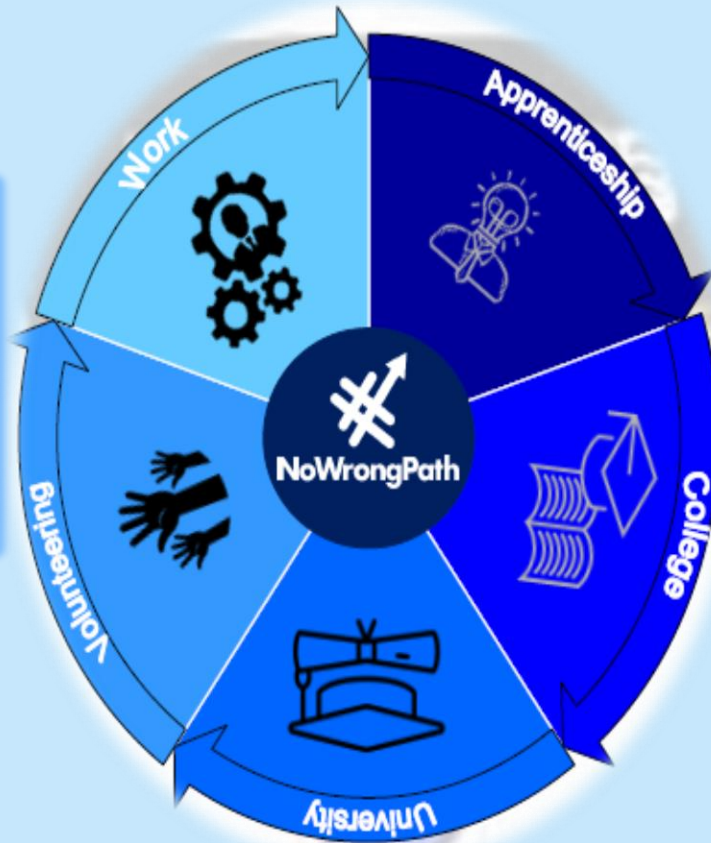
