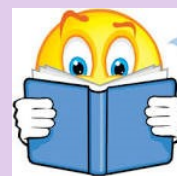

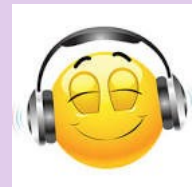

Three Simple But Effective Facts

- 1) Children born into communities with the most serious literacy challenges have some of the lowest life expectancies in the world.
- 2) Children who enjoy reading are 3 times more likely to have good mental wellbeing than children who do not enjoy reading.
- 3) Audiobooks can support wider literacy engagement.

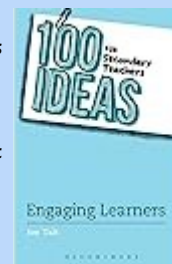
