# What is the Senior Phase Partnership (Vocational)?

The Senior Phase Partnership Programme offers a wide range of courses at SCQF Level 3-7 which are delivered at partner colleges and universities. Pupils can select a course that is relevant to their career path and study this at college while studying Nationals and Highers at school. The purpose of the programme is to help students develop knowledge and skills which will prepare them for the future job market, college or university.

# How do I apply?

# What is a Foundation Apprenticeship?

A Foundation Apprenticeship is a course that is delivered in partnership between school, college and an employer. The 2 year framework is offered to pupils in S5 and the 1 year frameworks are available to pupils in S6 (these are highlighted in bold below).

- Financial Services

- Gain a qualification recognised by employers
- Gain experience in your chosen career while still at school
- Develop self-confidence, problem solving and leadership skills
- Enhance your job prospects or college/university application

### What are the entry requirements?

- S5/6 pupils with a strong desire to work in industry
- Ability to achieve Higher grade over 2 years (1 year for S6 pupils)
