- ✓ Helps to support the transition from school exposure to different learning environment / work based learning/independent travel
- √ Two options available to students in S5/6:

Vocational Programme

- Pupils should discuss Senior Phase courses with their Guidance Teacher during the option choice process. (Highlight if you are interested in a College Programme by selecting the appropriate option within your option form: Vocational College Course / Foundation Apprenticeship)
- This year's Vocational prospectus will be shared via Teams/Satchel. Pupils who wish to undertake a
 Vocational Programme will need to complete a separate application form via Microsoft Forms.
- Online Application Forms for all Foundation Apprenticeships open in March and can be accessed at www.fapglasgow.scot
- It is important that all students choosing the senior phase option ensure it is the best progression pathway for their current year of study. If a student in S5 requires 5 Higher passes for entry to University/Apprenticeship, they may wish to consider studying a vocational programme in S6 instead.
- Please note if a student is successful in their chosen vocational programme, this will replace their column E subject choice.



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



Showing Progression

Admissions officers at College/University, Employers and Apprenticeship providers all look for PROGRESSION within a young person's curriculum.

S5 Progression (examples)

- If you are completing National 5's this year you should be aiming for Higher subjects next year.
- NPA's and Skills for work courses should only be considered if you are working on a mixture of National 4 and 5's this year and are looking to progress into a skills/employability based course.
- Avoid taking the easy option!!



Showing Progression Cont....

S6 Progression

If you require additional qualifications you should use S6 to:

- Meet any specific subject and grade requirements
- Take subjects which will develop and demonstrate relevant skills, e.g. essay based subjects for Social Sciences or Business; Art/Graphic Communication for Architecture
- Take subjects you are good at, to help you gain strong grades and ultimately build a strong CV

<u>Examples</u>

- If you are sitting Highers this year ideally you should be aiming for at least 1 Advanced Higher subject next year
- NPA's and Skills for work courses should only be considered if you are working on a
 mixture of National 4 and 5's this year and are looking to progress into a
 skills/employability based course.






