Developing the Young Workforce at Bishopbriggs Academy

Developing the Young Workforce (DYW) is a seven-year programme that aims to better prepare children and young people for the world of work. This programme builds on the foundations already in place as part of Curriculum for Excellence. The programme's headline aim is to reduce youth unemployment by 40% by 2021.

At Bishopbriggs Academy we are aware that in order to help prepare young people to reach a positive destination we must work closely with employers and help young people develop the skills and knowledge they will need to flourish in the workplace. We have a range of partners and employers who we work alongside to create meaningful and productive partnerships that build on good practice and existing links.



How Have We Developed the Young Work Force This Year?

This year we launched our first careers event for \$1. The purpose of this event was to provide \$1 with a range of career pathways and encourage them to think about potential careers that appeal to their strengths and interests.

During the week leading up to the event, all departments throughout the school delivered lessons on career pathways linked to their subjects. The week finished with a celebratory event where we welcomed over thirty partners in to the school. Throughout the course of the day, pupils experienced a range of interactive presentations, workshops and stalls hosted by our partners representing a wide variety of sectors. In addition to this, SI took part in a skills for learning, life and work workshop and were supported by our S6 WOW Ambassadors throughout the day.

Using what they had learned throughout the day, SI created a job specification for a career that interested them and included the skills and qualities required to be successful in this field. Overall, pupil and partners' feedback was extremely positive and we look forward to our new SI experiencing this next year!
